AL Bear: Chair Linda Combe

- We have a new stock of bears totaling 20 boxes, with 24 in each. Two boxes were recently sent to San Antonio Hospital.
- The new bear committee discussed ideas to successfully serve our agencies. Chair Linda Combe sent out a questionnaire to all agencies we currently contract with and 4 have responded or promised to respond. From these questionnaires we will now get a better idea of the following:
 - o Do you currently have a stock of bears on hand? How many?
 - O What do you project your needs for bears will be this year?
 - O What is the response from those receiving the bears?
 - o What is the response from those in charge of distributing the bears?
 - o Do those receiving the bears know who is providing them?
 - O What is the procedure for distribution?
- The committee was also asked to personally contact their assigned agency, and report back at the upcoming meeting.
- We decided not to add any new agencies at this time until we monitor the responses. A
 few committee members suggested adding Senior Living Homes. Toni reported she
 would find out if the current "description of recipients" fits senior citizens.

• We are beginning the year at a slower pace, delivering 2 boxes at a time to hospitals and agencies until we know more about overall agency needs and in keeping with our \$8,000 budget. Our budget must last throughout the year. Just over \$4000 was spent on the first order in August 2023.

Operation School Bell Closet: Chair Sue Goding

- The start-up clothing was delivered to the Chaffey Joint Union High School Closet including:
 - o Men's and women's zip hoodies, joggers, underwear and socks.
 - o Two bags of men's and women's jeans from the Thrift Shop.
 - o Tennis shoes from the Thrift Shop.
 - o Next month we will include children's clothes from the Thrift Shop.
- Book Drive
 - Donated high school level books will be collected during August and September.
 - The books will be wrapped and handed out as Christmas gifts in November at Eileen's Hope Closet located on the Chaffey Joint Union High School District Continuation School campus.
 - If ideas for the type of books that would be appropriate are needed, talk to some of our retired teachers.
 - A collection box is in Chapter House North for the donations and it will remain there until the September Chapter Meeting.
